



Neighborhood House Constance Currie Scholarship

Application deadline: May 8, 2020

The Constance Currie Education Fund was established in November 1959 in memory of Constance Currie to help people in the community further their post-secondary education.

To help people gain the skills, knowledge and confidence to thrive in diverse communities.

Who is Constance Currie?

Constance Currie was the Executive Director at Neighborhood House from 1918-1957. She was dedicated to education and to the community. The scholarship was created in her memory and honors her efforts of assisting community members pursue post-secondary education.

Applicant Eligibility

- must be seeking a first-time post-secondary education
- must have lived, worked, or volunteered within Saint Paul's West Side community (zip code 55107) at some point in their lives; or been actively involved with Neighborhood House Programs
- previous recipients are eligible to submit applications with a maximum of three awards per individual

Scholarship Awards

Scholarship awards range from \$1,000 to \$1,500. The annual number of awards are determined based on available funds. Recipients can use their scholarship for any school-related expense at their discretion.

Application Deadline (extended) May 8, 2019

Completed applications including all additional required documents must be received via email, fax or postmarked by the deadline to be eligible.

Award Selection Process

The Constance Currie Scholarship Committee will review and consider only ***complete applications which include all additional required documents.***

All qualified applicants will be notified of the committee's final decisions in early June. All finalists will be interviewed by the committee. Upon receipt of school registration verification, scholarship checks will be mailed to scholarship recipients.

Applications are rated on the following criteria:

- Personal Statement
- Personal, Academic & Life Achievements
- Community/Neighborhood House Activities
- Financial need
- Letters of recommendation

Eligible candidates must submit all required most current documents by the (extended) May 8, 2020 deadline to be considered.

Application – Fully completed application. Applications are available both online at www.neighb.org and the Wellstone Center reception desk.

Personal statement - Your personal statement of one to three pages is the most important part of the application, as it gives the committee a chance to learn what is special about you. See page 7 for additional personal statement guidelines.

Transcripts – most current school year transcript from high school or college (whichever is applicable). If you are not a current student, please provide your most recent high school or college transcript.

Two letters of recommendation

One letter from a current school staff member and the second from a non-relative. Returning adults should submit two letters from non-relatives.
